Manufacturer's Statement of Compliance with ADA requirements Aluminum Storm Door Product Line

To Whom It May Concern:

We are asked from time to time whether our storm door hardware meets American Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. We are unaware of and have to date not been furnished with specific test parameters or test specification references detailing what the ADA requirements are. However, after consulting our hardware suppliers, we document this Manufacturer's Statement of Compliance with ADA requirements as follows:

The American Disabilities Act <u>Federal Register 1991 Rules and Regulations</u>; Volume 56, Number 144, 1991:

"Section 4.13.9. Door Hardware. Handles, pulls, latches, locks, and other operating devises on accessible ... doors shall have a shape that is easy to grasp with one hand and does not require tight grasping, tight pinching, or twisting of the wrist to operate. Lever-operated mechanisms, push-type mechanisms, and U-shaped handles are acceptable designs."

The following available Don Young Storm Door Hardware conforms to and complies with the above quoted regulations:

- 1. DX Pull Handle set, includes push-exit latch
- 2. CR Bright Brass Lever Handle set, includes push exit latch
- 3. GL1581HL AB/GL Antique Brass Lever Handle, includes lever exit handle

We document this Manufacturer's Statement of Non-Compliance with ADA requirements as follows:

Standard Don Young Storm Door Hardware does not conform to or comply with ADA requirements.

The Don Young Company will review and respond to any documented specific test parameters or test specification references detailing requirements, rules, regulations, or other standards relating to the manufacture, assembly and operation of our Storm Door product line upon written request.
